Dear participant of the EPS 2021 conference,

The scientific program of the conference is complete now and we are very much looking forward to next week! This is the second conference bulletin with some reminders and additional, mainly technical information. The first bulletin can be found [here](#).

Zoom

All sessions of the conference will take place in Zoom. You can find the links to all Zoom sessions [here](#). There will be a common passcode to access all sessions of the conference. This passcode will be sent around to all registered participants per email before the start of the conference.

The Zoom chat can be used for questions and discussions during the session (see also the section "Mattermost" for another communication channel). Please follow the usual rules for online meetings (microphone and camera switched off, use the chat or raise-hand functionality for questions, only speak when asked by the session chair)

Live Webcast

In addition to the Zoom session, the plenary sessions can be followed via a live webcast streamed on the main conference Web page: https://www.eps-hep2021.eu/live_stream.

Recordings

Our plan is to record the presentations and make them publicly available via the Indico page with links to the DESY media streaming server. Parallel talks will be kept available for a week after the conference to allow participants from different time-zones to follow the conference. Plenary talks will be available for two months. Information on the needed speakers' consent for the recordings can be found below in the section "Information for speakers and poster presenters".



Mattermost

We have a dedicated [Mattermost instance](#) to allow questions and discussions during the conference. Signup information to this instance will be sent separately per email.

On Mattermost, we have created channels for each session track, which we invite you to use for discussions during and beyond the live sessions. You can sign up for the channels you are interested in. The channels can be found by clicking the “+” next to “Find channel” on the top left, and then go to “Browse channels”. We invite in particular the speakers and session chairs to sign up, so that they can react to questions and comments. We have also added a couple of help-channels, in case you have technical problems, for example with Indico or regarding the poster session.

Poster session

We will have a virtual poster exhibition, where close to 300 posters will be displayed. We will use the virtual platform Mozilla Hubs to as closely as possible approach the feel of a real poster session. The posters will be distributed between 30 different virtual rooms, each room hosting 10 posters. As scheduled on Indico, there will be a main poster session on Tuesday and the presenters are asked to be present during this session. During the additional poster sessions on Wednesday and Thursday the corresponding rooms in Mozilla Hub will be open, but it can happen that the poster presenters are not around.

Instructions on how to connect to the poster session and how to navigate the rooms can be found [here](#). There will be a PDF document indicating which poster can be found in which room.

We foresee this PDF document to also give links to the posters for browsing them outside the sessions. Alternatively you can also find the posters [on Indico](#) (click on the little “Funnel” symbol and select Type “Poster”. You can also select the session or speaker you are interested in).

If you are having trouble, please contact us through the Mattermost channel “Poster Session Technical Help”. There is also a “Poster session helpdesk” Zoom session which you can connect to in case of technical problems during the poster session.

Important information for speakers and poster presenters

To make life easier for the conveners we ask you to upload your contribution to the Indico of the conference yourself. If you do not have an account on the DESY Indico, it is very easy to register and ask for an account (see also [here](#)). As stated above, please also sign up to your session track on Mattermost, in case there are further questions or discussions during and after your session.

For the speakers: Please upload your slides in Indico at the latest the day before your talk, so that possible technical issues can be sorted out then. If all fails, you may ask the convener of your session to upload the talk for you. The Zoom rooms will be open 10 minutes before the sessions, in case audio



checks are needed. We expect that speakers share their slides via Zoom themselves and only in case of technical problems the session chairs will jump in to help.

Recording agreement for **parallel speakers**: Please register by Friday, July 23, via the [speaker release agreement on indico](#) and indicate if you give us permission to record your talk and make it available via the DESY webcast service for one week after the conference. Please note: this registration form is only meant to ask for your consent to the recording, it does not affect your participation in the conference. The information given in this form will not appear publicly. We will only make the recordings of the talks available, not the questions and answers.

Recording agreement for **plenary and review session speakers**: You were contacted separately. If you have not had a chance to get back to us, please do so as soon as possible. In particular we need the agreement of the plenary speakers to make the recording available through the “DESY Webcast service worldwide”.

In case we don't have a recording agreement of a speaker, the Zoom recording will be paused for the respective presentation and, of course, no recording of the talk will be available on Indico later.

For the poster session: Please upload your poster as a PDF file to [Indico](#), and contact the conveners only if this fails. Since we need to “place” the poster in the virtual poster session (and this you cannot do yourself) we asked everyone to upload before July 19, 2021. For those who asked for exceptions, we have found a way to accommodate you.
